# Easy Voting Tips

## **Get ready to vote:**

- Use the Sample Ballot mailed by your county elections office. It shows everything that will be on your ballot.
- Use the *Easy Voter Guide* and the [www.easyvoter.org](http://www.easyvoter.org) website to learn about the statewide candidates and ballot measures in plain language.
- Follow the news to learn more about the election.
- Talk about the issues and candidates with your family and friends.

## **Vote as you like:**

- You don't have to vote on everything on the ballot. Just vote for the things you care about, and skip the rest.

## **At your polling place on election day:**

- Bring your Vote Notes with you to help you cast your vote.
- You can bring a friend or family member to help you.
- Don't feel rushed. Take all the time you need, and feel free to ask a poll worker for help.
- If you make a mistake, you can ask for another ballot or ask a poll worker to help you.

## **Or, vote by mail:**

- You can use an “absentee ballot” to vote by mail. Send a written request to arrive at your county elections office by October 26. They will mail you a ballot to use at home.
- Mail your ballot back early, so it arrives before election day.
- Or, on election day, you can take your absentee ballot to any polling place in your county between 7 a.m. and 8 p.m.
