<u>Session One: Introduction to Health Literacy, Transnational</u> <u>Identity, and Immigrant Stories</u>

One of the primary goals for this study circle is to prepare participants to help their learners develop basic skills and strategies for staying healthy and accessing preventive health information. This Study Circle focuses specifically on lead poisoning prevention and awareness.

During Session One, participants will:

- Develop a shared understanding of the meaning of "transnational identity" and "health literacy"
- Identify language- and literacy-related barriers and issues faced by families who want to engage in lead prevention and screening activities
- Prepare to teach a lesson which taps learners' own experiences with lead poisoning and the challenges of staying healthy while remaining connected to countries of origin
